

Shepherd's Care Ministry! Congregational Care is an integral part of the ministry of Saint James Presbyterian Church. In an effort to respond to the call to care for one another, our new supply pastor along with the Session, Stephen Ministry, Deacons and Office Staff have developed the new Shepherd's Care ministry.

Shepherd's Care functions as a pastoral care arm of ministry. The purpose of the Shepherds Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence through visits and prayer during times of medical procedures, health crisis, transitions, and illness.

Our supply pastor is the primary provider for end of life care, bereavement and funerals. Our Shepherds Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

So how does it work? To help ensure that everyone has a Shepherd, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each group has been assigned a Shepherds care team member as seen below. If there is a need for prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship, members can call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email care@stjamespresby.org. The office will notify your Shepherds Care Provider immediately.

If there is an end of life situation, the supply pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the forget me not list. The Shepherd's Care Team has been thoroughly trained, and is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

Transition Team: What's Next in the Life of Saint James?

In the summer of 2018, Saint James welcomed Reverend Eustacia Moffett Marshall as the Temporary Supply Pastor. During that time, a committee called the Transition Team was appointed by the Session to coordinate with the Neighborhood Commission on Ministry (NCOM) of the Salem Presbytery. The purpose of the transition team is to complete a mission study and financial review of the church. The team is appointed by the Session and coordinates with the Commission on Ministry of the Salem Presbytery. With the approval of the mission study by the Salem Presbytery at its August meeting and the election of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) on the fourth Sunday in September, the work of the transition committee is now complete. We will continue to be in prayer for our church as the PNC begins the important work of finding a permanent pastor. Transition team members are: Sharon Gaskin, Paula Graves, Charles Knox, Bob Powell, Amryl Ward, and Lolita Watkins.

Your PNC continues to meet on the 1st and 4th Sundays in April. COVID-19 has not slowed us down. We are currently reviewing the Personal Information Forms (PIFs) that were matched with our Ministry Information Forms. The PIFs are like resumes with lots of details about the candidate's background, interests, statement of faith, self-reflections and other information. These forms can be 5-8 pages long depending upon their experience. We are grateful to have Zoom because it is allowing us to start the initial face to face screening of selected candidates. SOCIAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY MINISTRY

Purpose Statement: The purpose of our ministry is to **educate**, **empower**, and to encourage our congregation and community to become more actively engaged or **advocate** in policy-making decisions which affect the quality of our lives.

What we have done so far:

- 1. Community Bus Tour and discussion with city officials about the MLK neighborhood held on December 14, 2019
- 2. Reviewed Presbyterian Church USA website on our church becoming a Matthew 25 congregation
- 3. Three members attended a workshop on gentrification presented by Advance Carolina
- 4. Three members completed Voter Protector training offered by Democracy North Carolina to learn how to report voting irregularities or problems in the upcoming election cycle
- 5. One member attended a workshop on voting requirements and what's on the ballot updates sponsored by Democracy North Carolina
- 6. Members have attended public meetings regarding the new police chief, Guilford County Schools Board public discussion which focused on school discipline and student suspension, neighborhood historic preservation project for Benbow Park community, and local issues sharing by the Greensboro Pulpit Forum

Sponsorship/Collaboration:

- 1. SJPC Social Justice Advocacy Ministry hosted a Community Drop-In on Wednesday, February 19, 2020 for Benbow Park residents to come to the church to share about the houses built in their neighborhood by architect W. Edward " Blue " Jenkins. This information gathering event will help support local efforts to gain historic preservation status for homes built by our church member many years ago. Elder Robert "Bob" Powell from our ministry is very involved in this project.
- 2. The Social Justice Advocacy Ministry led the Saint James congregation effort for "Souls to the Polls" on Sunday, February 23, 2020 at Barber Park by encouraging church members to vote, providing transportation and educating church members by distributing 100 voting guides on state candidates. Website information was also provided to assist church members in learning about candidates from our state seeking federal offices.


In Case You Missed It! Faith Point Fellowship
