

Shepherd's Care Ministry! Congregational Care is an integral part of the ministry of Saint James Presbyterian Church. In an effort to respond to the call to care for one another, our new supply pastor along with the Session, Stephen Ministry, Deacons and Office Staff have developed the new Shepherd's Care ministry.

Shepherd's Care functions as a pastoral care arm of ministry. The purpose of the Shepherds Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence through visits and prayer during times of medical procedures, health crisis, transitions, and illness.

Our supply pastor is the primary provider for end of life care, bereavement and funerals. Our Shepherds Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

So how does it work? To help ensure that everyone has a Shepherd, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each group has been assigned a Shepherds care team member as seen below. If there is a need for prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship, members can call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email care@stjamespresby.org. The office will notify your Shepherds Care Provider immediately.

If there is an end of life situation, the supply pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the forget me not list. The Shepherd's Care Team has been thoroughly trained, and is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

Pastor Nominating Committee

Your Pastor Nominating Committee continues its work even during the COVID-19 pandemic. In early March, the Salem Presbytery approved our Ministry Information Form (MIF) which is our job announcement. We were authorized to begin our search. In mid-March, we received our first group of job applications from the church's employment website. At the same time, we started conducting our own search by contacting Presbyterian pastors, seminaries and targeted churches for referrals. To date, we have received 20 Personal Information Forms (PIFs) which are job applications and one referral.

We established a process for reviewing candidates because the PIFs are long and comprehensive. When we review PIFs, we check to see if the candidate has the leadership qualities and work experience that we identified as critical for the job. We also review videos of their sermons to get a sense of their preaching and communication style. If the candidate meets the basic criteria, we schedule a Zoom meeting with 3 of our PNC members to learn more about them. Each team reports back to the larger group and together we decide which candidates will get an interview with the entire team. We have been engaged in this process for the past 5 weeks and will continue as candidates come forward.

We are committed to keeping you informed about our process. A copy of the Ministry Information Form is posted on the Saint James website. There is a link on the main page. This allows you to see what our church is looking for in our next pastor. There will be a limited number of copies in the office. Contact our Administrative Coordinator, JaTonda to get a copy. Also, please consider asking a family member or friend to download the Ministry Information Form from the website at www.stjamespresby.org.

Working through the search process has been an exciting and educational experience for us. We welcome your questions and comments. Thank you for continuing to pray for our committee.

SOCIAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY MINISTRY

Purpose Statement: The purpose of our ministry is to **educate**, **empower**, and to encourage our congregation and community to become more actively engaged or **advocate** in policy-making decisions which affect the quality of our lives.

What we have done so far:

- 1. Community Bus Tour and discussion with city officials about the MLK neighborhood held on December 14, 2019
- 2. Reviewed Presbyterian Church USA website on our church becoming a Matthew 25 congregation
- 3. Three members attended a workshop on gentrification presented by Advance Carolina
- 4. Three members completed Voter Protector training offered by Democracy North Carolina to learn how to report voting irregularities or problems in the upcoming election cycle
- 5. One member attended a workshop on voting requirements and what's on the ballot updates sponsored by Democracy North Carolina
- 6. Members have attended public meetings regarding the new police chief, Guilford County Schools Board public discussion which focused on school discipline and student suspension, neighborhood historic preservation project for Benbow Park community, and local issues sharing by the Greensboro Pulpit Forum

Sponsorship/Collaboration:

- 1. SJPC Social Justice Advocacy Ministry hosted a Community Drop-In on Wednesday, February 19, 2020 for Benbow Park residents to come to the church to share about the houses built in their neighborhood by architect W. Edward "Blue "Jenkins. This information gathering event will help support local efforts to gain historic preservation status for homes built by our church member many years ago. Elder Robert "Bob" Powell from our ministry is very involved in this project.
- 2. The Social Justice Advocacy Ministry led the Saint James congregation effort for "Souls to the Polls" on Sunday, February 23, 2020 at Barber Park by encouraging church members to vote, providing transportation and educating church members by distributing 100 voting guides on state candidates. Website information was also provided to assist church members in learning about candidates from our state seeking federal offices.
