150th Anniversary Quilt Installation

Inspired by the commemorative quilt of our 125th anniversary, the quilt of our 150th year shows how St. James strives to make a church community of dynamic meaningful ministries. The quilt is made of 65 squares, representing the many ministries and meaningful symbols that come from the core: Worship, Discipleship, Evangelism, and Fellowship.

The quilt is truly a beautiful work from a diverse community brought together by God. Members of St. James put forth their creativity in various graphic mediums to express their organizations' mission in 10 inch squares. The quilt committee held workshops to inspire volunteers and introduce many to quilting and fiber arts. Once the squares were complete, several months were spent designing and assembling the many squares into a singular work of art; followed by a year of research on how to best frame the quilt to preserve it. The frame was custom built and installed by Hugh and H.P. Latham. The members of the quilt committee are Marcia Herring and Drucilla Pittman co-chairs. Toni Cross, Cynthia Latham, Beverly Hicks, and Angela Spinx. Special appreciation goes to our special quilting consultant Laurie Shaw. Her expertise was invaluable towards this effort. A special thank you goes to the many members and friends of St. James who donated their time and treasure towards this effort.

The quilt was unveiled and dedicated on Sunday, December 31, 2017. It was later

installed in the church July 2020.



Shepherd's Care Ministry! Congregational Care is an integral part of the ministry of Saint James Presbyterian Church. In an effort to respond to the call to care for one another, our new supply pastor along with the Session, Stephen Ministry, Deacons and Office Staff have developed the new Shepherd's Care ministry.

Shepherd's Care functions as a pastoral care arm of ministry. The purpose of the Shepherds Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence through visits and prayer during times of medical procedures, health crisis, transitions, and illness.

Our supply pastor is the primary provider for end of life care, bereavement and funerals. Our Shepherds Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

So how does it work? To help ensure that everyone has a Shepherd, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each group has been assigned a Shepherds care team member as seen below. If there is a need for prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship, members can call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email care@stjamespresby.org. The office will notify your Shepherds Care Provider immediately.

If there is an end of life situation, the supply pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the forget me not list. The Shepherd's Care Team has been thoroughly trained, and is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

SOCIAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY MINISTRY

A Get out The Vote (GOTV) committee was formed during the June workshop of our church Social Justice Advocacy Ministry. Eighteen voting rights advocates representing the Social Justice Advocacy Ministry and other church organizations held an initial meeting on Tuesday, July 7, 2020. Linda Sutton from Democracy North Carolina provided an overview of updates on voter registration, absentee balloting and ideas related to getting people to the polls to vote. Our committee discussed several strategies and initiated an absentee ballot request outreach to church members that started on July 16, 2020. Church members have picked up approximately 70 absentee ballot request folders that are available in the George Simkins room. We hope that members who have already picked up their forms will complete absentee ballot requests and return their forms to the Guilford County Elections Board by July 30, 2020. Other voting related strategies will be shared with the congregation during the upcoming months.
