

# From Rev. Landsen



I was born and raised in the small town of Morganton, NC with my mother, father, brother, and multiple family pets. My parents raised us in a Christian home where we attended Sunday school, Worship, VBS, and multiple Sunday afternoon "singings." These "singings" were worship services where my father's southern gospel quartet, The Gospel Enforcers, would sing along with other gospel groups and sometimes choirs producing a grand musical worship experience. As a woman of deep faith my mother taught me the importance and love for prayer.

Based upon my upbringing I began singing in my church choir at a young age and in a local gospel youth choir when I was a teenager. I also participated in youth groups such as the Buds of

Promise and Young Adult Missionary groups. In college, at UNCG, I was part of the Neo Black Society Gospel Choir and after moving to Charlotte, in my mid-twenties, I served as a preacher's steward, praise team member, gospel choir member and fitness instructor. Through these avenues I discerned a call for ministry.

I grew up in the AME (African Methodist Episcopal) Zion Church and while attending Rockwell AME Zion Church in Charlotte, NC, I began to sense a call for ministry; I was 26 years old. I struggled with the call for many reasons. I didn't see many women in pastoral roles growing up, and it was taught, in various churches I attended in college and otherwise, that women were not to lead within the church in that way. I always wanted to be a missionary and wear white dresses, hats, and gloves like the other ordained women. I told my minister, "I think I am called to ministry." He replied, "Okay, I want you to go home, read scripture, and pray for confirmation." After following my pastor's instructions, I soon received confirmation and began the journey toward accepting the call. I preached my initial sermon on February 26 2006, at Rockwell AME Zion Church.

In May 2006, I married the love of my life and joined his church, C. N. Jenkins PC. From there, I continued the training for pastoral ministry under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Jerry L. Cannon and the C. N. Jenkins faith community.

God has consistently reminded me to remain faithful to the call on my life and remain attuned to the voice of the Lord in all things. I know God will never lead me astray. God has dispelled the lie that women are not called to lead in the church in Senior Pastor roles and otherwise. God has helped me to see the gifts I have for ministry and leadership. God has helped me to love myself for who God created me to be unapologetically and unashamed to let my light shine. God has helped me to be confident while leading with grace and love and God continues to show me new gifts and a greater capacity to lead in the church and world. I am grateful for what God has done and continues to do in and through me.

#### WHEN CAN WE RETURN TO WORSHIP IN THE SANCTUARY? From Dr. Vanessa Haygood

This is the question we have all been waiting to have answered since we left in-person worship in March of 2020! The Coronavirus pandemic changed our lives quickly, and was fierce in its sweeping effect through the entire African American community and other communities of color. It savagely exposed the underbelly of the effects of systemic racism and disparate access to medical care. It collided with vivid demonstrations of brutalities under which African Americans and other people of color have existed at the hands of those who took an oath to "protect and serve".

The politicization of the pandemic widened the divisions between groups on either side of the political landscape in our country. The presidential election was held in the midst of the chaos of the pandemic. Still, it revealed the fervent desire of Americans to be involved in choosing a President who takes seriously the unsightly picture of what America's policies have wrought for a large percentages of its citizens, as they worked in spite of the pandemic to vote in historic numbers. At the same time, some kept it political by refusing to use safe and tested mask wearing and social distancing to curb the spread of the virus.

In spite of the efforts against public health measures like mask wearing, a safe and effective vaccine became available in record time, and in December of 2020, there seemed to be a ray of hope that the pandemic could indeed be controlled. Counter arguments that disregarded medical facts and spread rumors that the vaccine was harmful and should not be trusted were used to dampen the public's enthusiasm for using this evidence based weapon against the virus. The failure of the majority of Americans to quickly take advantage of increasingly available vaccines allowed a mutation in the coronavirus known as the Delta variant to change the course in our fight against this virus.

We now find ourselves in Guilford County with barely half our vaccine-eligible residents fully vaccinated. Our hospitals are again being overwhelmed with very sick COVID 19 patients causing them to delay non-COVID care such as routine preventative screenings and elective, but needed surgeries and procedures. Our children are trying to return to school, some for the first time in over a year with teachers and administrators concerned that outbreaks among students will shutter our schools again.

More to the point for us as a congregation, we yearn to see our fellow parishioners, to see our new pastor in person, to hear our beloved music and to witness the artistry of our gifted dance ministries. On the other hand we do not want to sacrifice the health and safety of our congregation for this goal.

It is important to understand that there is no truly "risk free" way of being in this pandemic. Every contact we have with the outside world involves some risk. Our best chance to minimize the risk of illness is be fully vaccinated ourselves, to wear masks when we are indoors with people whose vaccine status we do not know, and to maintain distance in public spaces. Remember, as many as 50% of those you come in contact with outside your home will not have been vaccinated. Those who have been vaccinated can still be infected with the virus, though they are unlikely to have severe symptoms or need to go to the hospital. Those who have not been vaccinated are at much higher risk of becoming infected, and if infection occurs, of becoming severely ill, requiring hospitalization and dying.

The other disturbing conclusion one can draw from the events of the past 8 months is that in Guilford County, if an individual is unvaccinated now, they don't want to be vaccinated. We are prayerful that the recent full, unconditional FDA approval of the Pfizer COVID vaccine may ease a few minds and may slightly increase our vaccination numbers. If more employers require vaccination as a condition of employment, that may also help. What is clear is that complete control of the virus will require vaccination or immunity from infection of 70-90% of residents.

As we ponder return to the sanctuary, knowledge is our best tool. This link will allow you to follow what is going on in our community and the state with respect to infections, hospitalizations and death. <u>https://www.conehealth.com/covid-19-information/</u>

Based on the above information, the session is not recommending return to the sanctuary in September. We are recommending that we review the status of infections, hospitalizations and vaccination rates to make a month to month decision about return to the sanctuary for group service. An informational congregational gathering will be held on September 12 immediately after virtual church service to give updates and answer additional questions.

**Congregational Care Ministry!** Congregational Care is an integral part of the ministry of Saint James Presbyterian Church. In an effort to respond to the call to care for one another, our new supply pastor along with the Session, Stephen Ministry, Deacons and Office Staff have developed the Congregational Care ministry.

Congregational Care functions as a pastoral care arm of ministry. The purpose of the Congregational Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence through visits and prayer during times of medical procedures, health crisis, transitions, and illness. Our supply pastor is the primary provider for end of life care, bereavement and funerals. Our Congregational Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

So how does it work? To help ensure that everyone has an Elder, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each group has been assigned a Congregational Care team member as seen below. If there is a need for prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship, members can call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email office@stjamespresby.org. The office will notify your Congregational Care Provider immediately.

If there is an end of life situation, the supply pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the Forget Me Not list. The Congregational Care Team has been thoroughly trained, and is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

#### Helping Older Adults Stay Steady

Staying Steady is a series on fall prevention. The information is from the S.T.E.A.D.I. program of the Centers for Disease Control. S.T.E.A.D.I. stands for Stopping Elderly Accidents, Deaths & Injuries. This article covers exercises to improve balance and strength.

Some things in life are a vicious cycle. Remember when you were learning the multiplication tables? They were hard and many of us didn't like them. So we didn't study and practice them. And we got further behind and the tables seemed harder and harder. We knew what we needed to do, but just couldn't make ourselves do it, and the problem got worse. I think many people are in the same situation when it comes to exercise. We know we should exercise in order to have a stronger heart, and more endurance. But we just don't like it, so we don't exercise. And our health doesn't get any better. And we get weaker and weaker. And that weakness increases the risk of falling.


Nobody wants to fall, to get injured, or even die from a fall. There are exercises out there that can keep you from falling. Wouldn't that be a good thing? Exercises that strengthen your legs and improve your balance are best for fall prevention. PACE wants to make sure the exercises you do are safe for you, so make sure you talk with your doctor, nurse practitioner or physical therapist about which exercises to start. Amy Stewart, DPT and Rehabilitation Supervisor for PACE, suggests starting with seated exercises first, until your balance can be checked. Then you can start a set of exercises best for you. Diane Hall, Recreational Therapist, leads a safe and beneficial chair exercise session. ### **Spread the Word: Emergency Rental Assistance**



Thanks to the American Rescue Plan, billions of dollars in federal rental assistance is reaching renters behind on housing costs, as well as landlords who have struggled during the pandemic. These programs are run locally, and right now emergency rental assistance is available across the country.

The federal government is continuing an all-out push and issuing a call to action to Members of Congress, state and local officials, companies, advocates, nonprofits, the faith community, and more to conduct an all-out push to make sure tenants and landlords take advantage of federal rental assistance to help cover rent, utilities, and other housing costs and keep people in their homes.

Please spread the word about emergency rental assistance. Help is available for renters who are having trouble paying rent, utilities or other housing costs as well as for landlords who have tenants in this situation. State and local programs are distributing billions of dollars in rental assistance.

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) recently developed a new "Rental Assistance Finder" tool for renters and landlords to find information on rental assistance in their area. The tool is now live at: <u>https://www.consumerfinance.gov/renthelp</u>

The CFPB's site also includes resources to help renters and landlords understand other resources to help navigate various financial hardships related to the pandemic.



### **NC COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATES**



Schedule your appointment now!

Eligible members of the public can make appointments online for a vaccine at the federally supported COVID-19 Community Vaccination Center in Greensboro at Four Seasons Town Centre:

- Appointments can be made online by visiting GSOmassvax.org
- North Carolina is setting aside half of all vaccination appointments from March 10th through March 14th (7,500 appointments) at the Four Seasons Town Centre site to help ensure individuals from Historically Marginalized Populations are able to access vaccine appointments.

Additional appointments are available through our call center for those who are not able to access the web-based registration tool. Appointments may be scheduled by phone (888-675-4567) through the COVID-19 Help Center. (Monday to Friday from 7am to 7pm, Saturday to Sunday from 8am to 4pm).
