



Congregational Care Ministry! Congregational Care is an integral part of the ministry of Saint James Presbyterian Church. In an effort to respond to the call to care for one another, our new supply pastor along with the Session, Stephen Ministry, Deacons and Office Staff have developed the Congregational Care ministry.

Congregational Care functions as a pastoral care arm of ministry. The purpose of the Congregational Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence through visits and prayer during times of medical procedures, health crisis, transitions, and illness. Our supply pastor is the primary provider for end of life care, bereavement and funerals. Our Congregational Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

So how does it work? To help ensure that everyone has an Elder, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each group has been assigned a Congregational Care team member as seen below. If there is a need for prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship, members can call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email office@stjamespresby.org. The office will notify your Congregational Care Provider immediately.

If there is an end of life situation, the supply pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the Forget Me Not list. The Congregational Care Team has been thoroughly trained, and is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

SOCIAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY MINISTRY

Social Justice Advocacy Ministry Connecting with Food Justice Issues

The Social Justice Advocacy Ministry was called or designated by our church leadership to guide the church in our becoming a Matthew 25 congregation. Our ministry work during this year has focused on that commitment in the areas of dismantling racism, eradicating poverty, and congregational vitality.

See a brief list of the work or accomplishments of our ministry in 2021:

1. Assisted church members in receiving COVID-19 vaccinations by providing information and arranging for appointments;

2. Became a community affiliate or sponsor of the community work of Every Baby Guilford in eliminating disparities related to childbirth, ending disproportionate deaths of babies of color, and empowering families;

3. Collaborated with the Micah Connections Ministry of Westminster Presbyterian Church in sponsoring a 6 week book study and discussion of Improving Our Acoustics for Hearing the Gospel. This spawned or has led to other collaborations as our two churches "heard, listened, and responded to God's call" gleaned from our book study;

4. Compiled over 4,000 documents on our church history for the Local Black Church History Project with UNC-Greensboro;

4. Developed a successful community dialogue series called Black & Brown Women's Community Dialogue with the Beloved Community Center which are held quarterly. The goal of the Black & Brown Women's dialogue series is to provide a platform for thoughtful discussion of social justice issues;

5. Engaged in workshops, presentations, or conferences related to themes such as culturally responsive education, infant mortality, racial equity training, economic empowerment, church mission work, and food justice;

6. Formed relationships with First Presbyterian Church, New Garden Friends Meeting, and Westminster Presbyterian Church to collaborate in joint servant and social justice work in our community (Formed a Joint Social Justice Committee);

7. Participated in shared worship experiences, Bible Study, and fellowship with Westminster Presbyterian Church members (Formed a Shared Worship Committee);

8. Partnered with Bread for the World (Piedmont Triad Chapter) in a community Prayer Vigil on Hunger & Food Justice which has prompted the Greensboro City Council to consider adopting a resolution on food insecurity to guide and prioritize their work in community revitalization;

9. Planned a Fall Food Summit on Hunger & Food Justice Issues which was well received and provided "a beginning step" in creating awareness of hunger and the creating of a food justice movement;

10. Pledged to work to support underutilized Black & Brown farmers to dismantle economic barriers of racism and "build a sustainable, community-centered food system anchored by black churches and black food producers".

• Be careful if you have to go outside. Dress warmly, including a scarf for your head and gloves/mittens for your hands. Wear non-skid shoes. Avoid strenuous activity. Walk carefully.

• Plan indoor activities to stay active and connected with friends and families. Call someone every day, maybe even a different person every day. Read. Exercise. Do a craft. Play a game.

• Know your weather terms

- Winter Weather Watch: There is a possibility of a winter storm within 12 48 hours.
- Winter Weather Warning: A winter storm is imminent within 12 24 hours or is occurring.
- Winter Weather Advisory: The winter storm could lead to life-threating situations if caution is not exercised.

• Have what you need in case the power goes out: o Ready-to-eat foods that don't need refrigeration or heating

- Water for everyone in the home, including pets
- Fully charged cell phone and/or a power bank to charge it
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Radio with extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Medications and list of your medications
- List of phone numbers of your family and friends you might want to contact
- If you use a generator or gas grill, use it outside away from windows to keep the carbon monoxide from getting in the home.



Spread the Word: Emergency Rental Assistance

Thanks to the American Rescue Plan, billions of dollars in federal rental assistance is reaching renters behind on housing costs, as well as landlords who have struggled during the pandemic. These programs are run locally, and right now emergency rental assistance is available across the country.

The federal government is continuing an all-out push and issuing a call to action to Members of Congress, state and local officials, companies, advocates, nonprofits, the faith community, and more to conduct an all-out push to make sure tenants and landlords take advantage of federal rental assistance to help cover rent, utilities, and other housing costs and keep people in their homes.

Please spread the word about emergency rental assistance. Help is available for renters who are having trouble paying rent, utilities or other housing costs as well as for landlords who have tenants in this situation. State and local programs are distributing billions of dollars in rental assistance.

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) recently developed a new "Rental Assistance Finder" tool for renters and landlords to find information on rental assistance in their area.
