# **May Lectionary**



Congregational Care Ministry! This is an integral part of Saint James Presbyterian Church. The purpose of the Congregational Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence, prayers, calls and cards during times of illness, medical procedures, health crisis, and transitions. Our Pastor is the primary provider for end-of-life care, bereavement, and funerals. Our Congregational Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was

admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to

prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

# How does Congregational Care Work?

To help ensure that everyone has an Elder, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each member of the congregation has been assigned a Congregational Care team member as seen below. Some examples of when to contact the church include but is not limited to prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship. Please call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email stjoffice820@gmail.com. The office will notify the Pastor and your Congregational Care Provider immediately. If there is an end-of-life situation, the Pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the Forget Me Not list. The Congregational Care Team is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

The Triad Black Faith Leaders & Black Farmers Network (TBFL& BFN) welcomed fifty individuals from across the Piedmont Triad at our first in person meeting as a coalition on Thursday, April 11, 2024. Our meeting was hosted by the Minority Women Business Enterprise Department of Guilford County at the Nussbaum Center for Entrepreneurship located on South Elm-Eugene Street. Faith based leaders attending represented Evangelical Fellowship Church of God (Positive Youth Development for Youth & Families), Poplar Grove AME Church, Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, Saint James Presbyterian Church, Saint Matthews United Methodist Church, Saint Phillips AME Zion Church, Shiloh Baptist Church, and the Winston-Salem Ministers Conference & Vicinity. Leaders from the New Hope Community Development Group, Cone Health Healthy Communities, Greensboro Housing Authority as well as staff members from the Forsyth and Guilford County Extension offices were also in attendance. Eighteen community gardeners and Black farmers from around the state were also in attendance. Our meeting was facilitated by Shaunne Thomas, director of MWBE/Guilford County who helped us in establishing smart goals for the next fifteen months in the following areas:

We will share specific events and programs developed at this meeting in the upcoming months. We ask for your continued prayers in addressing hunger and food insecurity in our community.


