



Congregational Care Ministry! This is an integral part of Saint James Presbyterian Church. The purpose of the Congregational Care ministry is to care for our congregation by providing presence, prayers, calls and cards during times of illness, medical procedures, health crisis, and transitions. Our Pastor is the primary provider for end-of-life care, bereavement, and funerals. Our Congregational Care team provides presence for ongoing care concerns. The foundation for this ministry is in scripture. Just as Moses was admonished to appoint elders to assist with the care of God's flock (Exodus 18); and just as the early church provided people to care for widows as the apostles gave themselves to prayer and the teaching of the word (Acts 2), our church stands in a biblical tradition to commission people of faith to provide for the care of God's people.

How does Congregational Care Work?

To help ensure that everyone has an Elder, including those on the Forget Me Not List, our congregation is divided into groups based on the first letter of your last name. Each member of the congregation has been assigned a Congregational Care team member as seen below. Some examples of when to contact the church include but is not limited to prayer, notice of a medical procedure or surgery, notice of a current or past hardship. Please call the church office at 336-273-6658 or email stjoffice820@gmail.com. The office will notify the Pastor and your Congregational Care Provider immediately. If there is an end-of-life situation, the Pastor is the primary provider. All information is private unless permission is given to share with the entire church during prayer and/or through the Forget Me Not list. The Congregational Care Team is eager to serve, so do not hesitate to share your need.

Advocacy Ministry and the Women's Voting

Initiative organized a successful Get Out the Vote Campaign 2024 through our Adopt a Precinct voter engagement strategy. With this community voter strategy, we focused on establishing relationships and sponsoring events in the historic Warnersville community, the oldest African American planned neighborhood in the City of Greensboro. Our group partnered with the Warnersville Community Association and planned various events which enabled our Adopt a Precinct Committee to share voter education information, register individuals to vote, and establish relationships to build from in supporting this close-knit community. Student leaders from Bennett College and North Carolina A&T State University participated in phone banking, neighborhood canvassing, event planning, and verifying voter registration as these were key areas of our focus. On Sunday, March 30, 2025, these young adult student leaders were recognized in our 10:00 am worship service by our Pastor Reverend Dr. Phanta Lansden and received certificates of appreciation in a reception held in the fellowship hall. Two middle school voter advocates, Kendall and Kora Emly and high school advocates, Cyrah and Victoria Hardy were also recognized for assisting with voter look-up verification after worship on Sunday, September 29, 2024.

The Adopt a Precinct Committee and the Black & Brown Women's Voting Initiative are involved in planning next steps in supporting our Warnersville neighbors and friends. Accomplishments of Triad Black Faith Leaders & Black Farmers Network 2024:

Officially became a 50l (C) non-profit organization, Established leadership council, by-laws and received funding from the USDA, Cone Health Foundation, Second Harvest Food Bank, First Presbyterian Church, Greensboro Men's Club, Saint James Presbyterian Church and several donors, Sponsored our second successful community farmers' market at Hayes Taylor YMCA on Juneteenth 2024, Assisted farmers in our Network in participating in a festival in High Point, North Carolina, Provided holiday fresh produce for the second year to over 500 individuals and families in Greensboro in December of 2024, Connected farmers in our Network with the NC Extension Office: Guilford County, Greensboro Housing Authority, and Greensboro NC Chapter of The Links, Inc. in providing fresh boxes of produce and prepared meals to 75 senior citizens in Greensboro, Sponsored a successful holiday mini-fresh produce market in the fellowship hall on Monday, December 23, 2024.

Family Support

SJPC Affordable Housing Committee along with West Market St UMC assisted our first family with moving from Pathways to a permanent residence. We were able to provide rental assistance to a single dad with 3 children living in transitional housing at Pathways to move into their own apartment.

IAHI Support

A special thanks to Session for approving the use of funds to assist IAHI with their non-profit application. At the March IAHI workgroup meeting we were advised that IAHI had received approval for its 501(c)3 non-profit status. This will allow for donations to be tax deductible and position IAHI for filing for grants.

Winter Shelter

Four IAHI participating churches provided nightly winter shelter and meals to 57 people experiencing homelessness during the months of December - March. This was the result of a partnership with Greensboro Urban Ministry and the City.
